equally divided and shared amongst my Brothers Arthur Allen, Joseph Allen
and Elizabeth Bridger and I do hereby appoint my Brothers Arthur & Joseph
Allen executors of this my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I have

I give to Rebecca my dearly beloved wife my Disposals the remainder
I give and bequeath to my well beloved son John Councill a Bay of pistold & hollards
and I give him two hundred acres of Land with his plantation where he ~
doth now dwell to him and his heirs for ever.

I give to my son Hodges Councill all my Carpenter & Builders Tools & those I have wrought
I give to my son James after his mother's decease the plantation where I now dwell
and all the land that belongs to it to him and his heirs for ever and if he dies
without heirs it must return to his brother John Councill & son John Councill

By Name to him and his heirs for ever. Likewise I give to my Son James one Heated bed and two blankets one Rugg and one Pott for these pieces of furniture I give to my daughter Sarah one Iron pott a ~~one~~ ^{one} book three Pewter Dishes and two Dishes likewise I make Rebecca my wife sole Executrix of this my last will and Testament by her freely possessed and enjoyed as witness my hand and seal.

bed and bedstee one by & Rugg and all other furniture thereof unto
belonging and one pair of Cloes and one small pair bed and one Iron
pott of about three gallons and pott hooks and three Pewter Dishes
and two Pewter plates and one young bow & Salt by his side and two
