

(81) Furniture and Two Cows and Calves I leave all my house & Land -
unto Elizabeth my wife so long as she remains a widow If she marry
I give unto Elizabeth my wife the manner plantation during her
life and after her decease I give the Manner plantation to Samuel
Farmer Wrench to him and the Heirs of his body lawfully begotten
forever I give unto my son John Wrench the plantation that Thomas
bail lived upon containing One hundred and two by Acres of Land to
him and the Heirs of his body lawfully begotten forever I set my
two sons of Age at Eighteen and to build a House upon the said Land -
where their Mother shall sit only to pay Six days work a year each
of them to their Mother so long as she is a widow I give unto Samuel
Farmer Wrench at Eighteen years of Age One Cow & Calf one pot & pan
if his Mother shall sit I give unto my son John Wrench one Cow and
Calf one pot and pan if his Mother shall sit I make Elizabeth my
wife Executor of this my last Will and Testament whosoever I set my
hand and seal the day & year above written John Wrench (the
Sealed signed and Delivered in the presence of
John F. Bail Jeyes Samble John Heard

And after the Death of my wife my Estates be Equally divided
between my two sons Samuel Farmer Wrench and John Wrench

I Desire that my Sister Mary Bradshaw keep my Daughter Elizabeth &
her Estate till she comes to the Age of Twenty Years
I Desire that John Forbille and his wife Mary Forbille keep my Two young
Children and their Estates till they come to the Age of Twenty Years &
for the bringing up of my Two Children I Give the said Forbille and his
wife the use of my Negro Woman Begg till they come to that age and then
I Give the said Negro Woman Begg and her Increase to my Three Daughters
