 Item I Give my Son John Howse my Coat and Shoes and one p. of Shilgards
 all my Carpenters Tools one Deal Chest one Bible and my part of
 The Boat and Sails and one Iron pot one brass Kettle
 Item I Give & bequeath to my Daughter Ester Howse my Bed & furniture
 whereon she and her Choyce of all my other Beds and furniture that

my son John House my Exec^r of this my last Will and Testament
to write up my hand and seal this 28th Day of March 1727/8
