I have now my soul to Almighty God who gave it and my body to this Earth to be buried in such decent manner as it shall seem convenient to my surviving hereafter masters and as to my temporal estate which it hath pleased God to give me I give and bequeath as followeth.

Item. I give & bequeath to Mary Tolley my dearly beloved wife one fourteenth part of all my moveable effects that please God to leave me with at the time of my departure hence.

Item. I give & bequeath unto John Tolley & Elizabeth my son & Daughter three hundred acres of land lying on the River of Blawith between the said land equally to be divided between my said son John & Elizabeth only excepted that my son John shall have the benefit of this land when it is divided.

Item. I give & bequeath unto my son James Tolley the plantation that now lies on to him of his heirs for ever but if my son James Tolley dy & without issue then to return to his brother John Tolley and his sister Elizabeth Tolley to be equally divided between them.

Item. my will is that my son James Tolley when he comes of age a certain sum in open Court to his brother John Tolley & his sister Elizabeth Tolley a certain tract of land lying on the land of Person Braswell containing three hundred & ten acres more or less or to pay them thirty thousand pounds of Cobs apiece and if my Daughter Elizabeth should die & without issue then her part to return to his brother John Tolley and his heirs for ever.

Item. I give & bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Tolley one now bed ticking and bedding.

Item. my will is that there shall be no appraisement of my effects.

Item. And my will is that my son John & James Tolley do & dwell with my wife Mary Tolley until they shall arrive at the age of twenty and one years of age and also my Daughter Elizabeth, my will is that she shall live with her said mother until she arrives at the age of eighteen or at the time of marriage.

Item. I constitute make & ordain my loving wife Mary Tolley to be my only Executor by name of this my last will & Testament as witness my hand & seal the day of year above written. James Tolley John signed sealed & delivered in the presence of us. John Roberts, Christopher Reynolds, John Smalley.
