

3) it being the Land whereon I now live with houses orchards out houses and
all profits commodities & hereditaments whatsoever to the same belonging or in
any way appertaining also I give unto my aforesaid son Barcroft Sampson one
new cast kettle belonging about four Gallons, one new Iron pott about four Gall:
one other pott abt two Gallons one Iron pottett, one Long Chim.

I give unto my beloved daughter Margaret Sampson one parcel of Land contain-
ing one hundred acres bounded along the road that now is which goes from the
Garden of Isaac Barretts house to Nicholas Ferrings line so west along till the
said quantity of one hundred acres of Land is bounde.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Elizabeth Sampson one certain
parcel of Land containing one hundred acres it being the plantation whereon
the wife Maddra now lives and so adjoining to the Land of Edward Brantley
by the side of Hurstle also one Iron pott.

I give and bequeath unto my beloved daughter Harry Ferring the plantation
whereon her husband Nicholas Ferring and she now dwelle to them and
their heirs for ever bounde as by a former deed of gift made by me to the
said Ferring for the said Land.

I do order and appoint that neither of my aforesaid children Barcroft, Margaret
and Elizabeth Sampson shall not sell any part of the Land given them but
that the same shall descend and go to their heirs male of their bodies
lawfully begotten for ever.

As to the rest residue and remainder of my Estate of what nature, kind, or
quality so ever as household stuff, horses, cattle, Hogs &c &c, I give equally
to be divided between my aforesaid three children Barcroft, Margaret, and
Elizabeth Sampson who I do nominate and appoint my whole Executors of
this my last will and Testament desiring my good friends Samuel Crafts &
Solmstrey to see this my will performed during the minority of my said
three children In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand & affixed
my seal this 30th day of November Annoq; 1727. James Sampson
