To my son William I give appt about two Gallons and appt of the same
second. I give my son Robert my young horse and her increase only the
first colt to my son Edward to Robert two dishes and one silver I to
my daughter Mary two hoppers and two dishes and one ewe I give to
my daughter Elizabeth two hoppers and two dishes and one ewe I give
to my son Edward one cow two dishes and one ewe I give to my son
John one cow two dishes and one ewe and all the rest of my estate
both within doors and without give to my well beloved wife and my
youngest daughter and I make my wife my whole & sole executrix
I give to my son John Lewis one ewe in whole of and part of my estate

into the hands of God that gave it and my body I do commend to the
earth to be buried in decent Christian burial at the discretion of my
loving friends nothing doubting but that resurrection I shall receive the same
again by the mighty Power of God and as touching such worldly estate
where with it hath pleased God to bless me in this life I give bequeath
and dispose of the same in the following manner & form. ~

I Give and bequeath to my son Richard Boulton all my whole Estate together
with all my household Goods Goods and moveables Effects.

I Give to Ann Hyde and her heirs and assigns.

I Give to Henry Bradley and his heirs and assigns.

I make and ordain William Simmons my ^{Exor} of this my last will and testa-
ment and I do hereby revoke and disannul all and every other former
wills Testaments before named and bequeathed ratifying and confirming
this and no other to be my last will and Testament. In witness whereof I
have hereunto set my hand and seal the Day and year above written I
do give that Ann Hyde may not be molested till my son Richard of age
be sealed by the said John Boulton as his. John^{mark} Boulton Seal

I do will and Testament in the presence of us the subscribers John Wathkins
and Sarah his wife Ann Hyde.

I John Boulton being sick
and weak but of perfect sense and memory do make ordain this
my last will and Testament first and Principally I bequeath my Soul
into the hands of Almighty God hoping through the merit of Jesus
and passion of my Saviour Jesus Christ to have full and free pardon
of all my sins and my body I bequeath to the Church to be decently buried
by my Executors hereafter named.

I Give and bequeath unto my loving wife Elizabeth Boulton the Land
and plantation whereon she now lives during her life or widowhood
and after her death or marrying I Give the said plantation and Land
unto my son William Boulton and his heirs for ever.

I Give unto Frances Leard one hundred acres of Land be it more or less
it being the Land whereon he now lives he paying for the said Land
by the tenth day of May next ensuing the Date hereof and if the said
Frances Leard shall fail to pay the money as by bargain and bill past-
then the said Land to return to my son William Boulton and his heirs for
ever but upon the said Leard paying the money as by bargain and
bill past unto my son William Boulton or to the Exor in his behalf then
the said Land to be the said Leard and his heirs for ever.
