my daughter Mary two Coffers and two dishes and one two I give to
my Daughter Elizabeth two Coffers and two dishes and one two I give
to my son Edward one bow two dishes and one two I give to my son
John two bow two dishes and one two and all the rest of my Estate
both within doors and without doors to my wife Elizabeth my
youngest Daughter and I make my wife my whole Executer
and to my son John Slocum one two in whole of and part of my Estate
to her Son Edmund Slocum her Son John Slocum. ~

then the said land to return to my son William Bould and his heirs for
ever but upon the said Ward paying the money as by bargain and
bill paid unto my son William Bould or to the h^t in his behalf then
the said land to be the said Ward and his heirs for ever.
