I, John Dooles of the Upper Parish in Isle of Wight County
being at present in perfect Health and in sound Memory Sense &
Understanding (Praise be to God) do considering my advancement
in Age and the Uncertainty of Life make and Ordain this my
last Will and Testament in manner following —

Imprimis I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Alice Dukes the Feather Bed, Bedstead and Cord I now lye upon (after the Decease of her Mother) with One pair of Blanketts, One pair of Sheets, One pair of Curtains & Valleys and One Rugg. Also Two Pewter Dishes, the one Eighteen the other Twenty Inches broad, One pewter Candlestick, one Iron Spit, One Tin Pudding Pan, one Brass Kettle containing Eighteen Gallons, one Pewter Plate, one Leather bottomed Chair and One Musket. *Item.* I Give & Bequeath to my Daughter Ann Doles, Two Pewter Dishes eighteen Inches broad, six Spoons, One Bed, Bedstead, Mat & Cord, One Rugg, One Pair of Blanketts, One Sheet and Bolster one Chest one Chair one Cedar Pail of four Gallons, one Iron Pot holding four Gallons, one pair of Pot Hooks, One pair of Fire Tongs, One framed Table, and One wooden Wheel. *Item.* I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Doles, one Bible, one Pewter Plate, Two pewter Dishes one eighteen the other Twenty Inches broad, One Candlestick, One Trunk, One brass Kettle containing Thirty Gallons, one Cedar Pail, one diamond square Rapier, one Gun fixed, and a Rush bottomed Chair. *Item.* I Give and Bequeath to my Daughter Ruth Doles four pewter Dishes 17, 18 and Twenty Inches broad, One pewter Pottle, Basin, One Gallon pewter Basin, Eighteen pewter Spoons, One pewter Baker, Two Chairs, One Trunk with two Drawers, One black Walnut Table & Horn, One Iron Pot with two Nicks broke out of it, One pair of Pot-hooks, One smoothing Iron and Clamps, Two pewter Plates, One Quart pewter Tawhard the Bed she now lyes on, the Bedstead & Cord, One pair of Blanketts, One pair of Sheets, one Iron Spit & dripping Pan, one brass Kettle holding two Gallons, one cedar Pail & Pigger, A Weavers Loom with Stays, Harness and what belongs to it, One pair of Stilliards and Pear-

my Daughter Susan Doles, Two pewter Dishes one 17 the other 18 Inches broad, One Pewter Bason holding a Pottle, Six Spoons, One Iron Pot of four Gallons, one Pair of Pot-hooks, and One Pair of Andirons, four Iron Wedges, the Bed she lyes on with one Baggy, Sheet, and pair of Blanketts & Bolster. All my working Tools of all sorts whatsoever and an Iron Bettle. A Cart and Lightwood Wheels with all the Gear thereunto belonging. One Rush bottomed Chair, one Chamber Pot, and all my Cyder Casks both New and Old, One large Iron bound Chest wth Lock & Key and One new Cedar Pail. All the Rest & Residue of my Goods not hereby disposed of I Give and Bequeath unto my two Daughters Ruth and Susannah to be Equally divided between them. Lastly I Nominate Constitute and Appoint my Loving Daughters Ruth & Susannah to be my Joint Executors to see this my Will performed hereby Revokeing & Disannulling all other Wills and acknowledge this only to be my last Will & Testament In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand & Seal this 23 day of August 1731.
