sick and weak of body but of perfect sense and memory calling to mind the
uncertainty of this life think fit to make this my last will and Testament
Committing my soul to God that gave it and my body to have a Christian burie
in the Church at the discretion of my Excutrix hereafter named and as for they
worldly good and Estate I Give and bestow in manner and form as followeth.

1st. I Give unto my Daughter Elizabeth my large walnut Table and a chest
with the biggest of the two last pots 2 pair of Iron pot Hooks
that stand by it and my great Bible and three Iron pots and all the wood
ware and materials ad pails tubs trays and spinning wheel of wood that
belong to the Kitchen and all my shoes and the light part of my Corn ad
may be at that time and my negro boy called Joe I Give her the use of him
of him for the space of ten years if he lived so long.

- 2d. I Give to my Grand Daughter Ratonen Goodwin a Gold ring.
- 3d. I Give to my Grand Son Benjamin Lawrence the value of thirty shillings to
be paid out of my Estate.
- 4d. I Give to my Grand Son James Scott the value of thirty shillings to be
paid out of my Estate.
- 5d. I Give to my Grand Son Richard Gunn Outland my silver beker and a small

I give also I give unto my three Grand Sons before named to wit
Jeremias Lawrence, Gunn best, & Rich and Equin Outland my negro
boy Joe equally betwixen them after ten years service to my Daughter
Elizabeth or at her death it in as bestor time.

6ly. I give to my Grand Daughter Ann Munkie a bed tick & bolster tick &
arrugg and ap^{ts} of sheets.

7ly. And all the remaining part of my Estate within doors and without
negro stock and house furniture I give equally to be divided betwix
my two Daughters to wit Mary Mackinny, Elizabeth Gunn, Jane Outland,
Mourning Scott and Christian Marsworth and a single part to my
Daughter Sarah deice her children equally and I appoint & ordain
my son William Scott to be my only and sole executor of &
this my last will and Testament which I own and ratify renouncing
all other wills formerly made ~~to~~ to which I set my hand and
this my seal this 9th day of Feb^r 1727.

do hereby make this my last will and Testament in manner and form as followeth
I give to my Grand Son Francis Brey the plantation his father lived on &
when he shall come to the age of sixteen years to him and his heirs &
forever. I give to my son William Brey and his heirs for ever sixty
acres of land or thereabout it being already marked out by me I give
to my son Sampson Brey one hundred acres of land adjoining on
his Brey Francis already marked out to him and his heirs for ever
and all my wearing clothes excepting my Coat I give to my son Hugh
Brey one small Esche and two Chard and my Parlet Coat. I give
to my Daughter Elizabeth Berry one feather bed and all furniture
thereunto belonging and two powder dishes.

Item. Provides my son Michael Brey shall stay and abide with me
and my wife during our natural lives then my plantation and all
the rest of my lands I give to him and his heirs for ever.
