

The Inventory of John Stevensons Estate. March the 25<sup>th</sup> 1727.

To 15 bushels of barley & 15 bushels of hoggs & a bushel of sloops & wheat and 3 iron pots  
and 3 iron kettles and 2 pairs of pot racks & 2 iron kettles & 2 iron skillets iron spoons  
iron smoothing iron & iron wedges & 1 pair of iron tongs & 1 iron pan & 3 saws & 3 scythes  
2 iron rings & staples & hatchet & iron narrow axes & 2 broad axes & 10 old hoes & 3  
heathen hoes & furniture & 9 beds, 4 beds & 3 chests & 8 oars & 1 trunk & 1 barrel  
of spinning wheel & 12 1/2 dozen baskets & 1 pair of hand tongs & 1 pair of tongs & 2 augers  
& 1 compass & 1300 Nails & 2 pairs of Cotton Cards & 2 pot racks & 4 water pails &  
washing tubs & lanterns & 1 candle & 2 powder horns & 1 powder stick & 3 powder  
horns & 2 powder flasks & 7 powder plated & 8 oz of powder spoons & 1 old  
barrel & 1 cedar of scales & 1 iron mending stone & 1 pair of salt wells & 1 barrel of salt  
pepper & 3 bars of tow lead, & 2 men's hats & 2 1/2 men's yarn stockings &  
1 1/2 men's worsted & 3 men's coats & 3 jackets & 2 1/2 men's breeches & 1

I John Evans of the County of King Lett in Virginia being at present  
sick and weak of body but of perfect sense and memory being to me the  
uncertainty of this life herein fit to make this my last will and Testament.  
Submitting my soul to God that gave it and my body to him a Christian buried  
in the earth at the intercession of my beloved hereafter named and as for them  
worldly goods and estate & his and hers in manner and form as followeth.  
1st. I give unto my daughter Elizabeth my large walnut Table and a Chest  
to wit the biggest & the two least pots & two pair of iron pot hooks -  
that stand by it and my great Bible and three iron pots and all the woods  
ware and materials as paid Elizabeth Gray and spinning wools of wool that  
belonged to the kitchen and all my sheep and the right part of my corn ad  
may be at that time and my negro boy called Tom I give her to use & sell  
of him for the space of ten years if she liveth so long.

2d. I give to my grand daughter Rose in a gold ring.

3d. I give to my grand son Jeremiah Lawrence the value of thirty shillings &  
20 paid out of my estate.

4th. I give to my grand son John Scott the value of thirty shillings to be  
paid out of my estate.

5th. I give to my grand son Richard Lynn Outland my silver boker as a memento.

I give also I give unto my third Grand Son before named to wit, Jeremiah Lawrence Esq; his estate which are Esq; in Outland my negro boy to equally between them after ten years service to my Daughter Elizabeth or at her death it in as her son.

64. I give to my Grand Daughter Ann Murray a bed tick & bolster tick of arugg and ap'nt of sheets.

74. And all the remaining part of my Estate within and without negro stock and house furniture I give equally to 68 divided between my two young heirs to wit Mary Mackey, Elizabeth Esq; Jane Outland, Mourning Scott and Christian Marsworthy and as my part to my young heir Sarah doce her children equally and I appoint Ordain my son in law William Scott to be my only and sole Executor of this my last will and Testament which I now and ratify renouncing all other wills formerly made ~~to~~ to which I set my hand and

to make this my last will and Testament in manner and form as followeth

Item. I give to my Grand Son Francis Breyer his plantation his Father had on a  
when he shall come to the age of sixteen years to him and his heirs  
to ever. I give to my son William Breyer and his heirs for ever fifty  
Acres of land or thereabout it being already marked out by me I give  
to my son Sampson Breyer one hundred Acres of land adjoyning on  
his Breyer Francis already marked out to him and his heirs for ever  
and all my waring plots of land inclosing my House I give to my son Hugh  
Breyer one small Table and two Chairs and my Parlor Cloak. I give  
to my Daughter Elizabeth Breyer one feather bed and all furnit'  
therunto belonging and two pewter dishes.

Item. Provided my son Michael Breyer shall stay and abide with me  
and my wife during our natural lives then my plantation and all  
the rest of my lands I give to him and his heirs for ever.
