buried in such decent manner as my Exors hereafter named shall
think fitt and as to my worldly Estate which it hath pleased God
to send me I give in manner and form following First my will is
that all those debts which I owe to any person whatsover be well
and truly paid within some convenient time after my Decease
by my Exors hereafter named.

Item. I give and bequeath my land in Carolina to my three sons John, Sam,
and Joseph Garland in manner and form following to John Ninety acres
to Samuel one hundred acres and to Joseph one hundred acres to them
and their heirs for ever.

Item. I give and bequeath to my son John Garland the plantation he now lives
on to him and his heirs for ever it being the land that I bought of John
Paze who gave Twenty pounds bond to acknowledge it in Court but never
performed my will is that my son John have that bond.

Item. I give and bequeath to my son Peter Garland the plantation he now
lives on to him and the heirs of his body lawfully begotten for ever.

in His and bequeaths to my sons John and Samuel and my Daughter Sarah eight
nine pounds of Silver which lies at Thomas Daughtryes to be equally divided between
them.

And I Give and bequeath to my loving wife and my son Joseph Garland and my daughters Ann, Prudence and Patience Garland all my power that I have at home to be equally divided between them.

u. I give of bequeath to my Daughter Mary Daughtry and Heafner and Heister.

I Give and bequeath to my Loving wife and my five youngest Children Sante and Joseph, Amy, Prudence, and Patience Gariand all the rest of my Estate to be equally divided between them and I do nominate and appoint my son John Gariand to be my whole and sole Executor of this my last will and testament In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this day and year above written.
