and Testament in manner and form following & witness my soul to Almighty God first  
who gave it and my body to be buried in a Christian like manner at the  
discretion hereof.

Item I give unto my well beloved wife Mary Hurst the wife of the plantainer &  
soft of William Price with houses & lands and all pertinences belonging unto  
thereunto in East of Gelt or Maris border it to be sold to the best advantage  
and produce thereof to be equally divided between my two sons  
James, & John, William, Philip, Walter Hurst also leaving my two sons  
James & Walter to be bound out to trades at the age of fourteen  
years to serve my son John to Lewis with his mother while his master  
to make a prop of him in respect to have here barrels of sugar from  
two hundred pounds of £ 200.

I give to my well beloved wife one negro woman named Nancy to  
serve her and her son & her daughter unto my wife Mary Hurst or her  
bed and furniture her first choice.

Item I give to my daughter Alicia one feather bed & furniture the next  
choice I give to my daughter Alicia one larg bras & bed I give to my  
daughter Alicia one board & looking glass and larg bibel after her  
mothers death.

Item I give to my daughter Mary one bed and furniture the next  
choice I give to my daughter Mary one larg bras & bed one iron pot & plates  
two larg dishes big plates and half a Doz<sup>r</sup> spoons and long Taschen

and from out Laking Glas one part of large pasture land & sticks one new house  
I give all the rest of my estate within and without to my dear and loving  
wife Mary Hurst begetting her & his to each of my sons one.

I give to my son John one holding a twenty six acre ring given by Dorothy  
Hurst her daughter and I name my dear and loving wife Mary Hurst my heir &  
sole heire of this my last will and Testament ad witness my hand & seal  
this 10<sup>th</sup> day of January in 1724. ~ John Hurst

**Fifth Article of His Will** I chalke Hylgham of the County of Wiget  
County do constitute and appoint this to be my last will & Testament & I am  
now making all other wills or wills heires to care maid by me and this to be  
my last will & Testament ad Hollards by gift. ~

I give and bequeath to my son John all my land to him and his heirs lawfully  
begotten of his body for ever.

I give and bequeath to my son John Hylgham own chalice of silver and Eastert  
and two pairs of Pistals and Hostars and Purse with belt and and Scuffill a  
soar and belt of two silver Spoons being a thousand of pence a pound and own  
farm spit and farm pot & all his wife give to my son John three negroes &  
Peter, Nell, and Pegg to him & his heirs for ever lawfully begotten of  
his body.

I give and bequeath to Granson Brown wif the son of Henry wif the Hurst  
child that are now of my negroes Nell or Pegg bringed that obred to the  
age of four years to be delivered to him at the age of one and two & six  
I give to my son John own Heather bed and bolster and bedstoo & board  
and rug affone blanket and sheet and own farm pot and own bows and  
garden likewise give him eight year old drugg & training.

I give own fine Matt to my brother Anthony Hylgham.

I give the yarde of my negro man called Peter to my dear & beloved  
wife Brown his wedlock and then to return to my son my deffair is  
that my negro man stays on the plantation this year my will &  
defair is that Hardy Council shall have & bring up of my son  
to take & bear of his estate and so bear by me my son John of  
age at eighteen.
