who gave it and my body to be buried in a Christian like manner at the

I give unto my wellbeloved wife Mary Hurst the use of the plantation &  
both of William Price with House & 3 acres and all pertunances belonging  
thereunto in case of Peter or Mary Jordan it to be sold to the best advantage  
and produce thereof to be equally divided between my two sons  
James, John, William, Philip, Walter Hurst I also desire my two sons  
Philip & Walter to be bound out to trades at the age of fourteen  
years forso my son John to live with his mother while she shall  
remain a free woman in England to have three barrels of Sugar Corn  
& two hundred pounds of Tobacco

I give to my wellbeloved wife one negro woman named Nancy to  
serve her and for ever I give unto my wife Mary Hurst one Heathen  
bed and furniture her first choice

I give to my Daughter Alicia one Heathen bed & furniture the next  
choice I give to my Daughter Alicia one large brass bed I give to my  
Daughter Alicia one silver looking glass one large silver after her  
mother's escape.

I give to my Daughter Mary one bed and furniture the next choice  
I give to my Daughter Mary one large brass bed one iron pot & 10 shovels  
two large silver plates and 2 silver spoons and 10 shovels

and from out Laking Glas one pair of large puton Bandelstike one new hie  
I give all the rest of my estate within and without to my Dear and Loving  
wife Mary Hurst excepting two Chists to each of my son and one.

I give to my son John one hold ring a twenty shilling ring given by Dorothy  
Hurst 1600 and I give my Dear and Loving wife Mary Hurst my hold of  
sole locatike of this my last will and Testament as witness my Hand & Seal

my last will & Testament as follows (by gift). ~

I give and bequeir to my son John all my land to him and his heirs lawfully begotten  
of his body for ever.

I give and bequeir to my son John Kulgiam one Chist of Straw and Bagout  
and two pairs of Pistall and Holstard and Burrow with belt and and sword  
and belt of two siler spoons a pair of puton spoons and one  
large spit and large pot and likewise give to my son John three negory  
Peter, Moll, and Pegg to him & his heirs for ever lawfully begotten of  
his body.

I give and bequeir to grandson Henry west the son of Henry west the Hurst  
Chist that are one of my negory Moll or Pegg bring that Chist to the  
age of three years to be delivered to him at the age of one and twenty

I give to my son John one feather bed and bolsters and bedstead & board  
and rug of one blanket one sheet and one large pot and one bowl and  
a barrel I likewise give him eight year of Trugot & turning.

I give one fine Hat to my brother Anthony Kulgiam.

I give the young of my negory man called Peter to my Dear & Beloved  
wife Mary her widowhood and then to return to my son my Sophia is  
that my negory Moll stay on the plantation this year my will &  
Sophia is that Harb Council shall care and bringing up of my son  
to take care of his estate and I do hereby make my son John of  
age at eight years.
