first day of December 1726.

I give and bequeath my soul to almighty God in hope of a glorious Resurrec-  
tion to eternal life and my body to be decently buried to the grave and buried  
and for all my worldly good that God of his mercy hath bestowed upon me  
I thank him as follows with

I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Byam a negro girl called  
Lucy and a mulatto boy called Ned the girl & child already in possession I  
give my Daughter Elizabeth my negro man <sup>Wife</sup> after my wifes decease to her  
and the issue of her body lawfully begotten for ever.

I give and bequeath to my Daughter Abigail Jones a mulatto girl called Alice  
and a mulatto boy called Frank and the increase of the said girl to her and the  
issue of her body lawfully begotten for ever I give my Daughter Abigail  
a feather bed and bolster likewise to my Daughter Abigail all the Land  
that stands on that side of the branch that Edward Jones now lives on

upon to her and the said of her body lawfully begotten for ever -  
Item. I give and bequeath to my Daughter Priscilla my Indian Girl man-  
to her and the said of her body lawfully begotten for ever & only my  
desire is that my Grand Son Sugar Land may have the first birth  
that the said woman brings and that he be to the age of two years and  
and to 60 kept at the charge of my Daughter Priscilla till it comes to  
the age of two years I give my Daughter Priscilla my negro boy  
Peter and am also girl Sarah to her and the said of her body &  
lawfully begotten for ever and the increase of the said girl I give  
my Daughter Priscilla a feather bed and bolster rug w/ blanket.  
I give to my Daughter Priscilla the plantation whereon I now live  
and all my land that I have belonging to the same plantation to-  
gether and the said of her body lawfully begotten for ever after  
my wife Elizabeth Sugard's going of the plantation my desire & intention  
is that my wife Elizabeth Sugard may have the labour of my Indian  
woman as long as she lives or abides on my plantation where I now  
live.

Item. I give and bequeath to my son and wife Elizabeth Sugard all the rest  
of my whole estate whatsoever during her natural life and  
after her decease if anything remains to be divided equally be-  
tween my three daughters and I do appoint my wife my widow  
and sole executrix of this my last will and Testament and I appoint  
John Person my overseer to see it fully performed In witness for  
whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this day and  
year first above written. as
