buried at the discretion of my Loving friends herein named nothing doubting but  
at the General resurrection I shall receive the same again by the mighty  
Power of God and for what worldly Estate it hath pleased God to bestow upon  
me in this life I give devise and dispose of the same in manner and form  
following my last words and funeral Charges being first paid.

Then I flew into my father Mary Bridger my negro wench named Agg at the day before married then I flew the said negro wench into my father James Bridger and laid low for ever.

I give and bequeath unto my son James Andrew my negro man called Dick and if he be unmarried or before the age of sixteen years attained to then I give my daughter Elizabeth to be married to the said James Andrew.

Then I gave into my sister Elizabeth my Green silk suit of clothes and a  
head clothed thereunto belonging.

4th m. I go into and burnit my habits but of the two I leave the first two into a  
company.

44m. I give unto Mary Brigger my land and saddle.

From I give unto my brother Arthur Allen my Tannaple Table 60 lbs and  
Two 60 Tannaple Washings.

From Iquo unto Katharine Allen six silver spoons.

Item. I gave unto James Allen two silver salts and salts spoon.

From. I Give unto my sister Miss Bridges my q.t. new silver Tankard.

Item. I Give unto my Sister Bridget my hand & ring.

From. I give unto Mary Bridger my small ring.

Stam. I give unto my brother-in-law my diamond ring that was Mr. Jay's.

Stom. I gave into Arbua wooden my striped Persian Cloth and lined w. Asian
