In the Name of God Amen I John Stevenson of the  
venerable Parish of Isle of Wight County being very sick and weak in body  
but of perfect mind and memory thank God to Almighty God for it and  
calling to mind the certainty of Death and the uncertainty of the time  
when to make this my last will and Testament in manner of form  
following first and principally I commit my soul to God my creature  
and redeemer and hope through the merits and death of my ever  
blessed Saviour and Redemer Jesus Christ to have full remission of  
all my sins and my body to the Earth to be decently buried at the  
discretion of my Executor hereafter named

First. and principally I do give and bequeath unto my son John Stevenson  
one wifor of about two year old.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto son Abraham Stevenson one loofe Boat.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto son Thomas Stevenson one old Hatch bed  
with one small rugg and one sheet of leather and one Tenant Saw.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto my son Charles Stevenson <sup>4</sup> value of 20 Shillings.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto my son George Stevenson one pair of clothes & Cloes.

Item. I do give and bequeath unto my daughter Mary Stevenson one Heated  
bed and bedstee one by & Rugg and all other furniture thereof unto  
belonging and one pair Cloes and one small pair toy and one Iron  
pott of about three gallons and pott hooks and three Pewter Dishes  
and two Pewter plates and one young bow & Salt by his side and two

bifid of about two years old and three young hds.

v. I do give unto my son William Stevenson all my lands to him and his wife and half of my cattle being equally divided after legacies paid and other half of my cattle to my loving wife being equally divided between my son William and my wife.

vi. I do also desir that my son William Stevenson shall have full possession of the said cattle by the tenth day of may next.

vii. I do give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Stevenson three sows and piggs and all the rest and residue of my estate wherein all my just debts and legacies are paid I do appoint my wife to have my full and lawfull living of this my last will and Testament dispensing & revoking all wills and testaments by me made as witness my hand the 23<sup>d</sup> day of November 1726

ever and to fall from him to him and never to be sold except to some  
of his Brothrs.
