Stone. I do give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Stevenson one part of Collier's Glass,
bed and bedstead one by bed rug and all other furniture there unto
belonging and one pair Clock and one small pair box and one iron
box of about three Gallons and four books and three pewter dishes
and two pewter plates and one young Cow's calf by her side and two

hundred of about two years old and three young hogs.

n. I do give unto my son William Stevenson all my lands to him and he is to hold and half of my cattle being equally divided after legacies paid and other half of my cattle to my loving wife being equally divided between my son William and my wife.

n. I do also desire that my son William Stevenson shall have full possession of the said cattle by the tenth day of may next.

n. I do give and bequeath unto my beloved wife Elizabeth Stevenson three cows and pigs and all the rest and residue of my estate when all my just debts and legacies are paid I do appoint my wife to be my full and lawful executrix of this my last will and Testament. Disannulling & revoking all wills and Testaments by me made as witness my hand this 23rd day of November 1726.
