she lyeth and all furniture belonging to it.

I give unto my loving daughter Ann Sargison the further good that I desire -
one my self and all the furniture that belongeth to it.

I leave unto my loving son John Surginer the above twenty shilling & Customs of Virginia in Commodities of the Country. And as for the rest of my Estate I will that it in any & equally divided among all the rest of my Children after my decease and I do make and ordain my loving son Robert Surginer to be my full and whole Executor of this my last will and testament And I do hereby utterly disallow revoke and disallow all other former wills by me before this time
