In the Name of God Amen Hobury the 25<sup>th</sup> 1726 I ~  
Joseph Copeland of the Isle of Wight County being indisposed in body  
out of sound and perfect mind and memory do make this my last  
will and Testament in writing as follows the Right.

I give & bequeath my soul to God that gave it me trusting by the ~  
merits of my Saviour Christ to attain to the resurrection of this my  
body to be decently buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter  
named and for such Estate as God shall intrust me with I give and hollow to  
Item I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Mary Copeland one negro  
woman named Moll to her and her heirs for ever I like my wife give ~  
her her riding horse and saddle and bridle.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son John Copeland one negro boy called  
Probin to him and his heirs for ever and I like my wife give him my pistols  
holsters and silver hilt sword I give and bequeath unto my son John  
two pocket handkerchiefs I have shipped on board Capt Murray for to ~  
purchase a still of forty fives gallons and all necessaries belonging  
to a still and if the same doth not clear the still my will is that ~  
my son John shall pay the remainder out of his Estate my wife ~  
having half the use of the said still during her natural life.

Item I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth Copeland one  
negro boy named Sam and one negro girl named Anna which two  
negroes I give to her and her heirs for ever and also one gold ring the  
same being as God decreed so we agreed.

Item I give and bequeath unto my son Thomas Copeland two negro girls  
named Judy and Lolo to him and his heirs for ever and I give him  
my Silver head Pains.

And my will is that the remainder of my Crop and provision killed  
into my house & for the support of my loving wife and family and  
the remainder of my Estate I desire may be appraised & equally  
divided between my loving wife and children my just debts being  
in the first place paid and discharged and remain my loving wife &c.  
of this my last will and Testament whereof I have hereunto set my hand  
and seal this 28<sup>th</sup> day of Feb: 1726

whole and sole Executrix of this my last will and Testament In testimony  
of all which I have hereunto set my hand and seal this 18<sup>th</sup> day of  
August 1726.
