Item. I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Elizabeth Jones to her
and plantation whereon she now lives during her life or widowhood
and after her death or marrying her the said plantation & land
unto my son William Jones and his heirs for ever.

Item. I give unto Francis Ward one hundred acres of land & it more or less
it being the land wherein he now lives & paying for the said land
by the tenth day of May next ensuing the date hereof and if the said
Francis Ward shall fail to pay the money as by bargain and bill past-
then the said land to return to my son William Jones and his heirs for
ever but upon the said lands paying the money as by bargain and
bill past unto my son William Jones or to the ^{2d} in his behalf then-
the said land to be the said lands and his heirs for ever.

Item. I give unto my loving wife Elizabeth one negro boy Called Robin to her and heirs for ever.

I give unto my son William Jones one negro boy Called Stephen to him my said son and his heirs for ever.

I give unto my daughter Mary Jones one negro girl Called Judy and her inheritance to her my said daughter and her heirs for ever Item. I give unto my loving son William Jones one good new feather bed and good new furniture to the said boy.

I give unto my son William six new dishes six new saucers six new porringers and one dozen of spoons six plates I give unto my said son one young horse one bridle and saddle and two bows & arrows and new pot and frying pan

Item. It is my will and desire that my son William Jones have full benefit of his labour at sixteen years of age and receive his part of estate at eighteen years of age.

I give unto my daughter Mary Jones one good new feather bed and good new furniture to the said boy six new dishes six new saucers six porringers one dozen of spoons six plates one ring and one horse young and side saddle.

Item. It is my will and desire that my daughter Mary receive her part of estate at the age of eighteen years but if either my son William or my daughter Mary should die without heirs lawfully begotten of their body then their part of estate to fall and go to the living heir either the male or female.

Item. It is my will and desire that my son William be taught to write and cipher perfectly as far as the vulgar rule of the floor and upon these accounts upon performance in schooling my said son as far as above mentioned that they forfeit to my said son out of the part of the estate given to my wife Elizabeth Twenty pounds current money It is my will and desire that my daughter Mary be taught to read the Bible perfect

Item. It is my will and desire that my part in the two negroes that I owned or my mother's ^{to} bequeath by name Abby & Betty unto my daughter Mary Jones.

Item. I give unto my son William all my waring clothes and all the rest of my estate goods and chattels whatsoever within doors and without.

I give unto my loving wife Elizabeth Jones and heirs for ever

Item. It is my will and desire that if any one of the negroes do any damage or wrong by any abuse from any person whatever

that there be satisfaction for the damage to either my son or daughter
whose negro is so rough.

It is my will and desire that my loving friend Mr Francis Williamson
and John Gunthor be trustees to see my will perfectly full filled.

and lastly I do appoint my loving wife Elizabeth Jones and my brother in
law William Finch in trust my whole and sole executor to this my last will
and testament looking dismantling and making void all other wills he etc to see
made by me witness who rook I have put my hand and seal this 5 day of
November 1726.

Joseph & John Jones (Seal)

Francis Ward the sum of Two hundred pound current money which
said money being due to Joseph Jones exec by bill past and contract for one-
hundred acres of land by estimation more or less sold to the said Ward by

to record as also the said receipt.

In the Name of God Amere the last will and Testament of Joseph Jones
being in perfect sense and memory thanks be to almighty God for it this 25th day of
November 1726.

I give and bequeath my soul to almighty God in hope of a glorious prepara-
tion to eternal life and my body to be decently born to the grave and buried
and for all my worldly good that god of his mercy hath bestowed upon me
thereon disposer of as follows [Writ]

I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Bynam a negro girl called
Lucy and a mulatto boy called Ned the girl she hath already in possession I
give my daughter Elizabeth my negro man after my wifes decease to her
and the issue of her body lawfully begotten for ever.

I give and bequeath to my daughter Abigail Jones a mulatto girl called Alice
and a mulatto boy called Frank and the increase of the said girl to her and the
issue of her body lawfully begotten for ever I give my daughter Abigail
a feather bed and bolster likewise to my daughter Abigail all the land
that I have on that side of the branch that Edward Jones now posses-
