unto my son William Jones and his heirs for ever.

I Give unto Francis Ward one hundred Acres of Land be it more or less
it being the Land whereon he now lives he paying for the said Land
by the tenth day of May next ensuing the Date hereof and if the said
Francis Ward shall fail to pay the money as by bargain and bill past-
then the said Land to return to my son William Jones and his heirs for
ever but upon the said Ward paying the money as by bargain and
bill past unto my son William Jones or to the Ex^{or} in his behalf then
the said Land to be the said Ward and his heirs for ever.

Item I give unto my loving wife Elizabeth one negro boy called Adam to her and her heirs for ever.

I give unto my son William Jones one negro boy called Stephen to him my said son and his heirs for ever.

I give unto my daughter Mary Jones one negro girl called Judy and her heirs to her my said daughter and her heirs for ever.

Item I give unto my loving son William Jones one good new feather bed and good new furniture to the said bed.

I give unto my son William six new dishes six new basins six new porringers and one dozen of spoons six plates I give unto my said son one young horse one bridle and saddle and two bows & balles and new pot and frying pan.

Item It is my will and desire that my son William Jones have the benefit of his labour at sixteen years of age and receive his part of estate at eighteen years of age.

I give unto my daughter Mary Jones one good new feather bed and good new furniture to the said bed six new dishes six new basins six porringers one dozen of spoons six plates one good ring and one horse young and saddle.

Item It is my will and desire that my daughter Mary receive her part of estate at the age of eighteen years but if either my son William or my daughter Mary should die without lawfully begotten of their body then their part of estate to fall and go to the living but either the male or female.

Item It is my will and desire that my son William be taught to write and by other perfectly as far as the vulgar rules of the three and upon these Executors you performances in schooling my said son as far as above mentioned that they forfeit to my said son out of the part of the estate given to my wife Elizabeth twenty pounds current money It is my will and desire that my daughter Mary be taught to read the bible perfect.

Item It is my will and desire that my part in the two negroes that is under my mother's bond to wit by name Toby & Betty unto my daughter Mary Jones.

Item I give unto my son William all my wearing clothes and all the rest of my estate goods and chattels whatsoever within doors and without.

I give unto my loving wife Elizabeth Jones and her heirs for ever.

Item It is my will and desire that if any one of the negroes receive any damage or wrong by any abuse from any person whatever

that there be satisfaction for the Damage to either my son or daughter
whose negro is so roused.

It is my will and desire that my loving friend Mr Francis Williamson
and John Dunkley be trustees to see my will perfectly fulfilled.

and lastly I do appoint my loving wife Elizabeth Jones and my brother in
law William Fincham trust my whole and sole executor to this my last will
and Testament, revoking disavowing and making void all other will heretofore
made by me with witness whereof I have put my hand and seal this 5 day of
December 1726.

I Give and bequeath to my Daughter Abigail Jones an amulato Girl called Alice
and an amulato boy called Frank and the increase of the said Girl to her and the
heirs of her body lawfully begotten for ever I Give my Daughter Abigail
a feather bed and bolster I Give to my Daughter Abigail all the Land
that I have on that side of the branch that Edward Jones now lives.
