I give and bequeath to my Daughter Ann Grafts one pair of small styliards and one smothering Iron to her and her heirs for ever.

And all the remainder of my Estate I give to be equally divided between my Son Benjamin Bell and Elizabeth Thrapp after my Just Debts and Legacies are paid except my land now her on and that I give to my Son Benjamin Bell and the issue of his body lawfully begotten and if he die without such issue then to my Daughter Elizabeth Thrapp and the issue of her body lawfully begotten and if she die without such issue then to my next heirs at Law. and lastly I do appoint said Grafts to be my whole & sole Executor of this my last will and Testament as witness my hand and seal this Twenty first day of March 1726.
