In the Name of God Amen I Mary Briggs being sick and weak of Body & Body but of sound and perfect sense and memory thanketh to Almighty God for a full & sound Constitution obtain and about time to be my last will and Testament in manner and forme following. First I exequato my soul to Almighty God who of his great mercy graceth me hoping through the merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ to inherit eternal life. Secondly I exequato my body to the ground to be decently buried & as my Executor hereafter named shall think fit.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Dray three hundred pounds Bunt money that is made over in bold Bridge or hands to her and her heirs for ever. Item I give and bequeath to my son Benjamin Bell one negroe man named Pompey to him and his heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Elizabeth Dray one oval Table and one spittoon and one black walnut Chest - and one brass kettle to her and her heirs for ever.

Item I give and bequeath to my daughter Ann Bratto one p' of small stile boards and one smoothing iron to her and her heirs for ever.

And all the remainder of my Estate I give to be equally divided between my son Benjamin Bell and Elizabeth Dray after my just debts and legacies are paid except my land here now and that I give to my son Benjamin Bell and the issue of his body lawfully begotten and if he die without such issue then to my daughter Elizabeth Dray and the issue of her body lawfully begotten and if she dy or w'thout such heirs then to my just heirs at large. And lastly I do appoint Sarah Bratto to be my witness of sole witness of this my last will and Testament as witness my hand and seal this Twenty-first day of March 1728. - Mary <sup>mark</sup> Briggs Esq'r

thereto belonging one bouie bed and all the furniture thereto  
belonging one large chest one iron pott.

I give to my son Thos Briggs one small pine Table.

I give to my son Sam'l Briggs one feather bed and furniture one bouie  
and bouie bed one iron pott and chest and what pewter he now has an  
end mare and all her marriage and account of all the furniture.

I give to my Daughter Mary Briggs one trunk & bed and all that belongs to it

I give to my Daughter Martha Brantley Two pounds

I give to my Daughter Mary Briggs one feather bed and furniture &  
one chest after her marriage.

I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Two pounds

I give to my son Thomas Briggs and my son Sam'l Briggs all my land  
I now have on to them and their heirs for ever.

And all the rest of my Estate I give to my loving wife to make use of  
appoint my loving wife to be my whole and sole Exec'tor of this my last
