and I give my daughter Margaret the 10 following negroes & right \$100, Negro slaves.
I give to my daughter Agathy my tract of land which is the survey of

^{for my son} heirs I hereby give & like wife I give her these following negroes & right, Frank
man, negro slave first.

I give to my son Britton one tract of land containing one hundred and
forty four acres in Warwick County bought of Edward Kippin and all his
land at Notaway River that I have not been witness before I give to him
nowise. and likewise I give to my son Britton these following negroes,
right Frank, Field at Notaway and Charriety. &

I give to my wife ^{living} these following negroes, Cowboy, Will, Tommy, Sarah my
wife & before it treat my wife in my disposal of these negroes among her slaves
now so said to me to fit.

I therefore that my land and stock in Brunswick County may be sold & then
used to recoup of it to return to my estate. and it is my desire that when
in my estate and belongings are paid I leave of the rest & remainder of my
estate to be equally divided between my loving wife and Britton, Ann -
Margaret, & after my children wherefore I appoint and leave my wife
and so by my acting of this my last will and Testament and making
all others void by me made as witness my hand & seal the 29th day
of Dec 1783

Earth to be buried in Christian burial and as for my worldly goods I dispose
of as follows.

and I give unto my loving son Robert Surgeon part of a parcel or tract of land given
to me by patent being the land wherein I now dwell that is from a line of
marked trees that is of the South west side of my plantation that runs the
abreast my land and from that line South westwardly as the bounds of my
parcel to the outward bound thereof to him and to his heirs lawfully begotten
out of his body and if he shall die without such heirs then to my son John Surgeon
the younger to his heirs lawfully begotten of his body.

Also I give unto my loving son Nathaniel Surgeon my plantation and the rest
of my land to him and to his heirs lawfully begotten of his body but if he dies
without heirs the said land to my loving son John Surgeon the younger
to him and to his heirs lawfully begotten of his body.

Also I give unto my loving daughter Mary Surgeon the Heir of whom -
she and all furniture belonging to it.

I give unto my loving daughter Ann Surgeon the further bed that I did die
one myself and all the furniture that belongeth to it.

Also I leave unto my loving son John Surgeon the sum twenty shillings & current coin
of Virginia in Consideration of the Country. And as for the rest of my Estate I desire
that it may be equally divided among all the rest of my children after my decease
and I do make and ordain my loving son Robert Surgeon to be my full and
whole Executor of this my last will and testament and I do hereby utterly
abolish & revoke and disallow all other former wills by me before this time.
