 and a negro Girl Fido.
 I give to my Son Britton one Tract of Land containing one Acre and
 forty two Acres in Warwick County bought of Edward Hippien and all the
 Land at Notaway River that I have not bequeathed before I give to him
 and his wife. and I know for I give to my Son Britton these following negroes.
 Gift / Frank, Fido at Notaway and Charity. &
 I give to my ^{loving} wife these following negroes, Tom Boy, Will, Tommy, Sarah my
 will is before is that my wife may dispose of these negroes among her Chil-
 dren as she thinks fit.

I desire that my Land and Stock in Brunswick County may be sold & the
 neat proceeds of it to return to my estate. and it is my desire that when
 my debts and charges are paid I leave the rest & remainder of my
 estate to be equally divided between my loving wife and children, Ann -
 Margaret, together my children wherefore I appoint and leave my wife
 full and sole executrix of this my last will and testament and making
 all other wills by me made as witness my hand & seal this 29th Jan^y 1741

leave unto my loving son John Burgin the two twenty shilling & Custom
of Virginia in Commodities of the Country. And as for the rest of my Estate I desire
that it may be equally divided among all the rest of my Children after my decease
and I do make and ordain my loving son Robert Burgin to be my full and
whole Executor of this my last will and testament And I do hereby utterly
disallow revoke and disallow all other former wills by me before this time
