I Desire that my Sister Mary Bradshaw keep my Daughter Elizabeth
her Estate till she comes to the age of twenty years
I Desire that John Corble and his wife Mary Corble keep my Two Young
Children and their Estates till they come to the age of twenty years &
for the bringing up of my two Children I give the said Corble and his
wife the use of my Negro Woman Dolly till they come to that age and then
I give the said Negro Woman Dolly and her Increases to my Three Daughter
