In the name of God Amen I Robert Richards being in perfect Health and memory thanke be to God Do Ordain this to be my last will and Testament first I Commit my Soul to Almighty God in whom I hope to receive forgiveness for all my sins and my body to be Decently buried in the Earth from whence it came by my Exec^r hereafter named

I Give to my Loving wife two feather beds and her Chayre of furniture to them

I Give my ale the household that I had with her and two Basons and two plates

I Give my wife One Iron pot and one frying pan one Bell - mottle Collet one odd Skin Trunk and one Chest one Box one - Boxen and all the goods I have that is not made up and to take what she pleases of the Earthen ware and One third of what I have out of Doors

I Give to my Son William one Brass Kettle

I Give to my Granddaughter Rudence Driver one feather bed and furniture

I Give to my Granddaughter Rudence Richards a small Trunk

I Give to my Granddaughter Rudence Driver my Daughter Daughter one Spier Noctar

I Give all the rest of my household goods to my Son William to my Granddaughter Rudence Driver & Rudence Richards to be Equally Divided among them and all the rest of my Estate out of Doors I Give to my Two Sons Robert and Thomas this being Ordained to be my Last Will and Testament revoking all other wills either Written or Spoken and I Do ordain my Loving wife and my Son Robert to be my whole and sole Exec^r of this my Last Will and Testament as Witness to my hand this 11th day of August One thousand seven hundred twenty four Robert R. Richards

It is my Desire that my Exec^{rs} before named shal not give Security for their performance of my will

In the name of God Amen I John Gray of W^{est} Wight County being weak in body but thanks be to Almighty God in perfect sound mind and memory do Instructe and Ordain this my last Will and Testament First I give to Almighty God my soul & Body who is my Creator and Redeemer and my Body to be Decently buried in the Earth and after my lawfull Debts of Right be paid and my just Expenses Comply'd with all them I give the rest of my Estate as followeth I give and bequeath to my dear and loving wife Ann Gray her (to be usually) Liv^{ing} in and furnished as it now stands a black Trunk I give to my son Richard Gray one Cow & my largest silver Dish I give to my son Aaron Gray the Bed he lies on and covering thereon belonging and my Gun and sword and my young mare and the C^{ow} which was his grandfathers

I give to my Daughter Ann W^{est} one Cow
I give to my Daughter Mary Gray the new Bed and Table & the sh^{et} my Exec^{trix} hereafter named do find her a Rugg for it
I give to my Daughter Sarah Gray one Bed and the covering to it
I give to my Daughter Elizabeth Gray one Bed and covering to it
And I order after the above said Legacies be Complied with all that the rest of my Estate be Divided equally between my wife and my Children now with me namely Aaron Mary Sarah and Elizabeth Gray and in case of either of them failing to the Survivors of them And I do nominate and Appoint my my two sons Richard and Aaron Gray my whole and sole Exec^{rs} to this my last Will and Testament.
