In the Name of God Amen I Thomas Crafts of the upper parts of the County of wiglit County in Virginia being at this time weak of a Body but perfect in memory thought fitt to make this my last will & Testament in manner and form as followeth.

- I Give to my loving wife Mary Crafts my best bed and all the furniture thereunto belonging and my chest that stands at my best head and all that is in that chest one Iron pott one large brass fitt & six flag Shure and all the pewter of all sorts that belongs to me & all my salt Coy. belongs to me.
- I Give to my son Thos^o Crafts one large feather bed and all the furniture thereunto belonging one Couch bed and all the furniture thereunto belonging one large chest one Iron pott.
- I Give to my son John Crafts one small Iron Table.
- I Give to my son Samuel Crafts one feather bed and furniture one Couch and Couch bed one Iron pott one chest and what pewter he now has and sundry and all her increase one room & all the furniture.
- I Give to my Daughter Mary Crafts one trundel bed and all that belongs to it.
- I Give to my Daughter Martha Brautley Twelve pence.
- I Give to my Daughter Mary Crafts one feather bed and furniture & one chest after her Mother's decease.
- I Give to my Daughter Elizabeth Twelve Twelve pence.
- I Give to my son Thomas Crafts and my son Samuel Crafts all my land I now live on to them and their heirs for ever.

And all the rest of my Estate I Give to my loving wife I make her my executrix and appoint my loving wife to be my wife and sole Exor^r of this my last will and Testament as witness my hand and seal this 29th day of October 1737 signed sealed and acknowledged the word seal interlined before signed and her Son my son Thomas Crafts Esq^r with us in the presence of.

and memory thank God to God for it Do appoint this to be my last will & testament
making void and annulling all other will by me made & made and bequeath my soul
to God that gave it me and my body to the Parke to be buried in a Christian like man-
ner at the discretion of my Exors my Exors being first paid & the rest of my Estate
in terms follow.

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Maker one negro man named Jacob
to her and her heirs lawfully begotten for ever & one brass kettle & one Iron pot.

I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Ann Maker one negro Girl named Phillis
and her increase to her and her heirs lawfully begotten for ever all out her first
child and that I give to my Daughter Susannah Maker after womanhood to her and her
heirs lawfully begotten for ever I give my best household and furniture & all long
silver it and four pewter dishes and six plates one Silver tin pan when she shall
come to the age of lightness or married.

I give and bequeath to the child that I now get with all one negro Girl named
Rachel and fifteen loads of Battles & two of them bows and two coffers and
two Hoggs it is my desire that the Battles and Hogs should be for the nursing
child when it comes to the age of lightness or married.

I give to my Daughter Susannah Maker one feather bed with it furniture & all long
to it and one gold ring and twenty shilling to give her every year when
she shall come to the age of lightness or married.

I give all the rest of my Estate to be equally divided between my four eldest
children and if either of the three youngest dies without issue their legacy
to be equally divided among the four eldest and I do appoint George Jug
and William Dixon my Exors and so be Exors of this my last will & testament
wherein is as witness my hand this 17th day of June 1722 It is my desire
that George Jug and William Dixon should take care of my children and their legacies
and that the work of the negroes should be to maintain them.
