and Testament. First and principally I bequeath my Soul into the hands
of Almighty God hoping through the merit Death and passion of
my Saviour Jesus Christ to have full and free pardon of all my Sins
and my body I Commit to the ground to be decently buried by my
Executors hereafter named

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my Brother Jonathan Joyner my Plantation
and Land where I Live being Two hundred and fifty Acres To him my
said Bro Jonathan Joyner and his Heirs forever
I Give unto my Brother Matthew Joyner & my three Sisters Cherry
Batavia and Elizabeth Joyner to each one Five

Item I Give unto my Brother Alexander Joyner Two hundred and seventy
five Acres of Land out of the Survey of Land that I bought of Col.
Allen Beginning at the Lower end at a Corner to a White Oak -
Landing in the Side of Jacobs Swamp a little below the mouth of
Round Hill and up round hill Swamp to the Deep Branch and up
the Deep Branch to the outside Line To him my said Brother
Alexander Joyner and his Heirs forever

Item I Give unto my Brother in Law John Dunkley the remainder part
of the said Tract of Land that is from the mouth of the Deep branch
to the Upper end being One hundred and twenty five Acres to him
my said Brother in Law John Dunkley and his Heirs forever -
I Give unto my Brother in Law John Dunkley one Double loon &
Two pistoles and Twenty eight head of Hogs and One ^{Bar} of Piggs
And all the rest of my Estate Goods & Chattels whatsoever I Give -
unto my Brothers Alexander Joyner and his Heirs forever And
Lastly I Do appoint my Bro^r Alexander Joyner & my Brother in Law
John Dunkley my whole and sole Exec. to this my last Will and
Testament Robbing Disannulling and making void all other
Wills here before made by me In witness whereof I have here
unto put my hand and Seal to this my last Will and Testament
this 8 Day of April 1728 Tho. Joyner (Seal)
