and disposing mind and memory aforesaid be given up to Almighty
God therefore and calling to remembrance the frailty of Human nature
the certainty of Death and uncertainty of the time when I shall be called hence
and declare this my last will and Testament in manner & form following
First and principally I commend my soul to God the Father of Spirits
esp[ecially] trusting through the merits and bitter passion of my Beloved
Saviour Jesus Christ to receive full pardon and remission of all my sins
whensoever this mortal life shall end and my Body to the Earth to
be decently buried after the manner of Christian Burial at the Discretion
of my Executors hereafter named and for what worldly goods it hath
pleased God to bestow me without I give Bequeath and Dispose of
as follows

Item I give and bequeath to my loving wife Elizabeth one hundred
white Mares for her use and my Negro fellow Harry and his land of the
plantation called the frostbit during her natural life and after her
decease I give the said Negro and plantation to my son Harry.

Item I give and bequeath to my son Thomas my little mare called Maria.

Item I give and bequeath two large poster Dishes a piece of iron my children
and three little pieces that is to say one for one wife & one for
Item I give forty head of sheep to be divided amongst my children

Item I give to my loving wife twenty head of sheep and two cows

Item I give and bequeath to my son John my pistols & Holsters & sword and one
bed and furniture at the first bot

Item I give all the residue and remainder of my Estate of what nature or
quality soever I give and bequeath as follows

Item I give to my son James my bed that I lie on and the furniture
belonging to it

Item I give to my loving wife my best bed and furniture belonging to it
that lies up in the Chamber

Item I give to my Daughter Mary one bed and furniture that she lies on

Item I give all the residue and remainder of my Estate of what nature or
quality soever I give and bequeath to all my Children to be Equally
Divided according to their kind thereof earnestly requesting my two
friends Jane and John Davis to see the same Equally Divided
at my Decease and it is my will and Desire that each Childs part
be Divided before and remain with my wife while the age of twenty -
one or married and I do here by nominate and Appoint my loving
wife Elizabeth and my son John my sole Executor of this my last will
and Testament and Testimony whereof I have set my hand and seal
this 14th of Feb^r. 1726/7
