the hands of Almighty God that gave it me and my Body to this
Earth to be buried after a Christian manner and for such worthy
inter and Entombes as it shall please God to bless me with all in this
life after all my lawfull debts and Dues are paid I give and
bequeath in manner and form following

I give and bequeath to my loving Son Benjamin Farecloth my
brother bed and furniture that I lie on my self and also my
Wife wife and all appurtenances therunto belonging And two
hundred acres of Land lying my plantation whereon I lie
on the South side of the House to him and his Heires forever And
I give without Reserve to his Brother Moses Farecloth &
his Heires

Item I Give and bequeath to loving Son Moses Farecloth one of my
beds & Bedside and also One Dish and One Basin of Pewter And
also give and bequeath to my son Moses Farecloth the plantation
on the North side of the House with one hundred acres of Land there
unto belonging to him and his Heires forever
