his Life and that it is appointed for all men to die To make and
Declare this my last Will and Testament in manner and form
following Principally and first of all I recommend my soul into
the hands of Almighty God that gave it me and my Body to the
Earth to be buried after a Christian manner and for such worthy
uses and Estates as it shall pleased God to bestow me with all in this
Life after all my lawfull Debts and Dues are paid I give and
bequeath in manner and form following

I give and bequeath to my loving son Benjamin Farecloth my
father bed and furniture that I Lie on my self and also my
father Wile and all appurtenances thereto belonging And two
hundred Acres of Land lying my plantation whereon I live
on the south side of the Wile to him and his Heirs forever And
if he die without Heir to fall to his Brother Moses Farecloth &
his Heirs

I give and bequeath to my loving son Moses Farecloth one father
bed & Bedstead and also One Dish and One Basin of Pewter And
also give and bequeath to my son Moses Farecloth the plantation
on the north side of the Wile with one hundred Acres of Land there
unto belonging to him and his Heirs forever

I give and bequeath to my Daughter Hannah Farecloth one
Cow and Yearling and Two Hens that are called Hens and also One

36 One feather Bed and furniture the Bed having a Cotton Tick and One
bedded Trunk

1600 I give and bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Mosser one cow &
yearling

1600 I give and bequeath to my Daughter Sarah Revel five Shillings
