In the name of God Amen I William Green being in
 Health and senses praised be God for the same but knowing the
 uncertainty of this Life do make this my last will & Testament
 in manner and form as follows the first I give and bequeath my
 Soul to God who gave it hoping through the merits of Jesus
 Christ to receive full pardon of all my Sins and as for my Body
 after this breath departed to be buried in the Earth to have the
 Christian like burial according to the Discretion of my Exor^r and as
 for my worldly Goods God hath blessed me with I give as follows
 Item I give and bequeath unto my son Barthelemy Green all
 my Lands & Houses belonging to the Tract of Land I now live on &
 Two hundred Acres of Land where Christopher Dickinson was liveth
 to him his Heirs lawfully begotten of his Body forever & give to
 him a young Horse and a Swooping Saddle and Bridle pistols and
 Holsters Rapier and Belt and a Fan and I give to my said son my
 Mill in the upper parish of this County now in the Occupation
 of Henry White for Capt Joseph Bridges life but at the Decease
 of the s^d Bridges my said Mill to belong to my son Barthelemy
 Green and his Heirs forever Item I give and bequeath unto my
 son George Green all my Lands and Houses and my Water Grist
 Mill and all the Appurtenances thereunto belonging at the profit
 in the Tenure & Occupation of William Davis except ones third
 of the profits reserves to my Loving wife Mary Green during her
 life all which Lands Houses and Water Grist Mills with all the
 Appurtenances to him the said George Green and his Heirs
 forever and I give him my said son my Negro man called James
 after his Mothers Decease my Seal Gold ring and a Fan Item
 I give to my Daughter Sarah Brown One Cow and two Sheep

I Give to Martha Montgomery one young Sheep & Give to Mary Green Six both Green and Green Green the three Daughters of Mary Green Widow one Sheep to each of the three Children in proportion Item I Give to my Daughter Prudence Green One feather Bed and furniture and One pair Mare Saddle and Bridle and a Trunk, Item I Give to my Daughter Rebecca One feather Bed and furniture Two Cows and three Sheep six plates One Dozen of Spoons Two Basons Two Dishes One Iron pot frying pan and pewter Chamber pot and as for all the rest of my Estate both real and personal I Give the use of all to my Loving wife Mary Green as long as she lives and bears my name and I Do otherwise and Allow that my wife Mary Green shall Give to my Children of my Estate the use of which I Left to her to Give to my Children in Equal proportion as she shall think just and the remainder of all my Estate to be Equally Divided between my wife and Children according to the said thereof by Samuel Davis John Davis Christopher Dickinson Arthur Smith and I Do nominate and Appoint my Loving wife Mary Green & Samuel Davis to be my Exors^{or} of this my last will & Testam^{ent} In witness hereof I have hereunto set my hand & seal the day & year first Written Signed Sealed and Declared to be the Last Will and Testam^{ent} of William Green Sen^{ior}
