In the name of God. Amen. I know all Men by these presents that I Charles Hensworthy being in perfect Memory & Remembrance praised be God for it be I in a last Estate in Body do make & Ordain this my last Will & Testament in manner & form following. First I Bequeath my Soul into the Hands of Almighty God my Maker hoping through Jesus Christ his Redemptor free Pardon for all my Sins.

And my Body to be Buried in Christian manner at the Discretion of my Executor hereafter mentioned. *Item* I Give unto my dear-ly beloved Wife Ann Horsworthy my Negro Woman called Doll, and my Negro Woman called Wan. *Item* I Give to my eldest Son Charles my Negro Boy called Dick, and my Negro Girl called Jegg, my Silver Tankard, my Silver Hilted Swords my Case Pistols & Holsters, my Brandy Still & Worm, one Gold Ring. *Item* I Give to my second Son Thomas my Negro Boy called Mingo, one Gold Ring. *Item* I Give to my Third Son George my Negro Girl called Moll, one Gold Ring. *Item* I Give to my Daughter Ann my Negro Girl called Antey, one Gold Ring, my Silver Salt Seller. *Item* I likewise Give to my son Thomas seven Silver Spoons. *Item* I Also Give to my son George one Silver Tumbler and two Silver Cups. *Item* I Give unto the Child my Wife now goes with if lives to the Age of Twenty One or Marries Fifteen Pounds Current Money to be paid my Executor out of my Estate when called. *Item* The Legacies given to my son Charles if in case he dies before he comes of Age to receive them, then these Legacies I Give to my son Thomas, and in Case Thomas dies and Charles survives then Thomas's Legacies to my son Charles, and in case both should Die and George survive then I Give both these Legacies to my son George, and in Case George dies then the Legacies given him I Give to my Daughter Ann, and in Case Ann dies and George survives then Ann's Legacy I Give to my son George. &c. *Item* The Remainder of my Estate after my Debts and Legacies paid to be equally divided between my Wife and Children (namely) Charles, Thomas, George, Ann, and after the Fifteen Pounds paid the Child my Wife now goes with to have an equal part with my Wife & Children afore mentioned. *At Witness* my Hand & Seal this seventeenth Day November in the Year of our Lord one Thousand seven Hundred Thirty four. And do Appoint my dearly beloved Wife my whole and sole Executor
