Batting of the County of Wight being Sick and weak of Body but Sound and perfect in memory and senses think fit to make this my Last Will and Testament in manner and form following.

First and principally I give and Bequeath my Soul to God who gave it, and my Body to the Earth from whence it was taken to be Buried in a Decent and Christian like manner and after my Debts are Justly Satisfied, all my personall Estate to be Disposed of as followeth.

Item I give and Bequeath unto my son John Batting the plantation whereon he now lives containing One Hundred & eighty Acres Bound already by a line of marked Trees to him and his Heirs for ever.

Item I give ^{& Bequeath} unto my son Daniel Batting the plantation whereon I now dwell with all the Remainder of my Land to him and his Heirs for ever.

Item I give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Esther Batting one Feather Bed & Furniture to her and her Heirs for ever. Also one Cow to her and her Heirs for ever.

Item I give and Bequeath unto my Loving Wife Sarah Batting all my Hogs, Sheep and Geese and one Feather Bed and Furniture to her

to her proper use with the crop of Tobacco also
 I give and Bequeath unto my son Daniel Batting one Quarter
 Part with all the other things & Creatures befalling him
 and his Heirs for ever.

I give and Bequeath unto my Loving Wife Sarah Batting
 and my three Daughters Jean Patience & Priscilla all
 the Remainder of my moveable Estate to be Equally Divided
 among them To them and theirs for ever. Also I do appoint
 my Loving Wife Sarah to be my whole and Sole Executrix of
 this my last Will and Testament to see the same performed &
 truly executed according to the true intent and meaning thereof
 Disannulling & Revoking all other and former Wills by me
 made or caused to be made In Witness whereof I have
 hereunto set my hand this Twenty Second Day of January
 in the Year of our Lord God one Thousand Seven Hundred
 and Forty.
