The Tenth day of May 1735. I Garret Williams of the County of the Isle of Wight being very Sick & Weak but of perfect Mind & Memory Thanks be given to God calling to mind the mortality of my Body and knowing that it is appointed for all Men once to dye do make & ordain this my last Will & Testament. *Imprimis* I Give & Bequeath to Elizabeth my well beloved Wife and the Heirs of her Body lawfully begotten for ever my Plantation and all my Land thereunto belonging, all my Cattle Goods Tools and moveable Effects and Immoveable to Elizabeth my dearly beloved Wife all my Household Goods and all my whole Estate. But if she should Marry I desire that my Son Daniel should have the lower part of the Land belonging to the said Plantation whereon I now live. I make & Ordain Elizabeth my dearly beloved Wife Executrix of this my last Will & Testament with all my Lands Mesuages Tenements by her freely to be enjoyed. And I do hereby utterly disallow revoke & disannul all and every other former Testaments Wills Executors by me any ways before named Willed & Bequeathed Reddying & Confirming this and no other to be my last Will & Testament.
