in manner following.

Bed & Furniture and four Pewter Plates, and two Pewter Candle-  
sticks and three Basons two of middle size and one small one  
and one sizeable Iron Pott & Pott Hooks and Two Washing Tubs  
and Four Pails & a Doz<sup>r</sup> Hogg<sup>s</sup>.

Herr. I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Martha Miles One Bed-  
and Furniture and four Pewter Plates and Three Basons two of  
two of a middle size and one small one, and one large pine  
Chest and one small Iron Pott and one Iron Skillet and one  
Iron Skillet.

Wom<sup>r</sup> I Give and Bequeath unto my Son Joseph Miles One pine  
Chest and my Gun & sword & batouch Box and a sealed Ring  
of about Nineteen Shillings Weight and three Pewter Dishes  
and one old fashioned Pewter Basin and half a dozen Hogg<sup>s</sup>  
and one large Iron Pettle & two wearing Hats.

Herr. I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Miles one  
Bed Skirt.

Herr. I Give & Bequeath unto John Frizzell my Coach & Sails  
and Cart & Wheels and York & Paris Cords I do nominate  
and Appoint John Frizzell my sole Executor of this my last Will  
and Testament and my Will & Desire is that John Frizzell  
my have the care of my son Joseph Miles until he shall  
come of Age And I do hereby Utterly Disallow It ische and  
Disannull all and every other former Wills Legacies Bequest  
and Executors Ratifying and Confirming this and no other  
to be my last Will & Testament In witness whereof I  
have set my Hand & Seal the 17<sup>th</sup> day of Aug<sup>o</sup> 1761 —

ter my death is paid may go towards the Victualing my Family
