in manner & following.

I Give and Bequeath unto my Loving Wife Lucy Wiles One
Bed & Furniture and four pewter plates, and two pewter Candle-
sticks and three Basons two of middle size and one small one
and one sizeable Iron pott & pott Hooks and Two Washing Tubbs
and four pails & 2 a Doz. Eggs.

I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Martha Wiles One Bed-
and Furniture and four pewter plates and Three Basons two of
two of a middle size and one small one, and one large pine-
Chest and one small Iron pott and one Iron Skillet and one
Iron Skillet.

I Give and Bequeath unto my Son Joseph Wiles One pine
Chest and my Gun sword & Catouch Box and a sealed Ring
of about Nineten shillings Weight and three pewter Dishes
and one old fashioned pewter Bason and half a Dozen Eggs
and one large Iron pestle & two wearing Hatts.

I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Wiles one
Wed. Ticking.

I Give & Bequeath unto John Frizzell my penknives & Sails
and Cart & Wheels and yoke & pins. And I do nominate
and Appoint John Frizzell my sole Executor of this my last Will
and Testament and my Will & Desire is that John Frizzell
my have the Care of my Son Joseph Wiles untill he shall
come of Age And I do hereby utterly Disavow Revokes and
Disanull all and every other former Wills Legacies Bequest
and Executors Ratifying and Confirming this and no other
to be my last Will & Testament In Witness whereof I
have set my Hand & Seal the 17th day of Aug^r 1744.

- my plants is paid may go towards the Victualing my Family

At a Court held for the County of Wight December 28th 1741.
The last Will & Testament of Joseph Miles deceased was presented in
Court by John Fingell the Executor therein named who made oath
thereto and being proved by the Oath of John Ballard who also
deposed that he saw John Driver subscribe the same as a Wit-
ness thereto is admitted to Record.

and appoint this my last Will and Testament in manner and

with Curtains & Vallains.

Item. I Give to my Grand son John Williams son of David Williams three
 pewter Dishes six pewter plates and one Iron pot with pot-
hooks. Item I Give to my Grand Daughter Mary Williams
Daughter of Rich^d. Williams one pewter Dish.

Item. I Give to my Grand son Eliza Williams one Chest and three pu-
an Masons and one Iron pot & pot hooks one Iron Shillet one
off the Tong of a pair of Mill yards and one Iron pot Hack
