 Chattles what soever to my four living Brothers to be equally divided
 Between them which are Edward John Joseph & Isaac and to be
 severally disannul and make void all former wills and testaments by me
 heretofore made In Witness whereof I have set my hand and put my
 Seal this 10th day of September in the year of our Lord Christ One thousand
 Seven hundred and thirty seven Also I desire that Capt. Sam^l Little
 in New England may Act as a trustee for my friends and send whom
 he thinks fitting with a power of Attorney for to receive the Estate by
 the first opportunity after my Exor: have made up an Act Legit^{ly}
 here in Virginia.
