and time after my decease by my Exor: hereafter named I desire that my
two Sons James and Matthew should have One Shilling ff piece and the

Thos and George Floid and Joseph Floid and I making my Son George Floid
Exor: but my great Wish is give to my Son Francis Floid more than the rest
