In the name of Good Amers I John Duck being very sick and weak but in perfect sense and Memory doth make this my last Will and Testament Renouncing all former Wills & Legacies before made I give and bequeath my Soul to Almighty God who gave it to me and my Body to the Earth to be Decently buried as my Executor shall think fitt

Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Miss Duck Ten pounds Current money to be paid to her out of the profits of this land and Plantation now live on and likewise I give & bequeath to my Daughter Miss Duck One new feather bed and turned upstead & a good Cugg Blankett and sheet

Item I give and bequeath to my loving wife Priscilla Duck One new Bed & bedstead & a good Cugg Blankett & sheet

Item I give and bequeath to my loving wife Priscilla Duck the Lane and Plantation now live on to her and her heirs for ever only paying the afore mentioned Ten pounds to my Daughter - Item I give and bequeath to my Daughter Miss Duck my Negro boy Ebo but my Will is that my loving wife Priscilla Duck shall have the labour of the aforesaid Negro until my daughter Miss Duck comes to the age of twenty years & then to be delivered to her and her heirs for ever

And all the Remains part of my Personal Estate what so ever my Will and desire is that it may be Equally Divided between my Wife and my Daughter Miss Duck

And likewise I do make and appoint my loving Wife my whole and sole Executrix of this my last Will and Testament as Wit-
ness my hand and Seal this twentieth day of March 1735/
