Isle of Wight County Yeoman being sick & weak in Body but of sound and
perfect Judgment & Memory praise be given to God for the same, and
calling to Mind the Mortality of my Body and that it is appointed for
all Men once to Dye do make & ordain this to be my last Will and
Testament in manner and form as following (viz) First & Principally
I commend my Soul into the Hands of the Almighty God my Creator —
assuredly believing that I shall receive full Pardon & Remission of my
 manifold Sins & Transgressions thro' the Merits of my only Lord &
Saviour Jesus Christ and my Body to the Earth from whence it was
taken to be Buried in such decent & Christianly manner as to my Executors
herein after named shall seem meet And as touching such Worldly Estate
wherewith it hath pleased Almighty God of his most gracious & bountiful
Mercy to bestow on me this Life I give devise & dispose of the same as
followeth (that is to say) Imprimis I Will & Ordain that all such
Debts Dues & Demands as I owe in Right or Conscience to any manner of
Person or Persons whatsoever be well truly satisfied contented and paid by
my Executors after named within convenient time after my Decease —
I Give & Bequeath to my Daughter Mary Carr two breeding Sows and
one Heifer. Item I Give & Bequeath to my Daughter Elizabeth Carr
two Sows & Pigs using at Bennetts Tacosons Item. I Give & Bequeath to my
Daughter Sarah Carr one white Heifer and one poise of Money weighing six
Shillings. Item. I Give & Bequeath to my Son William Carr one Gun and
Wedges and all my Cooper Tools. Item. I Give & Bequeath to my Son
Hardy my Plantation wheres I now dwell. Item I Give & Bequeath to
my Daughter Grace one Dish and one Plate. And one Bed & Furniture

to my Son Hardy. Item I Give & Bequeath to my Son John Carr one Shilling in Money and no more. Item I Give & Bequeath to my Son Robert Carr one Shilling in Money and no more. Item I Give & Bequeath to my Daughter Eleanor Duck one Shilling in Money and no more. Item I Give & Bequeath all the rest of my Estate to my dear & well beloved Wife, but if she Dyes or happens to Marry then that part of my Estate to be equally divided amongst her and my three young Sons, only Twenty Shillings to my Son Hardy for to put him to School. And my Will is that my Son John Carr shall keep the Money till a convenient Time to put him to School. Item I do hereby Revoke Disannul and make Void all Wills Testaments & Legacies by me heretofore made, and do Declare this and none other to be my last Will & Testament. And lastly I do hereby Nominate and Appoint my trusty & well beloved Friend Robert Carr my Son & sole Executor of this my last Will & Testament. In Witness whereof I the said John Carr have hereunto set my Hand & Seal the 19th Day of May in the Year of our Lord 1734.
