 dequing for ever. I hereby give unto my loving daughter Elizabeth unto her
 for Elizabeth's share to her living and one feather bed further
 more I hereby give my eldest son Thomas Varnal to see that I have
 done of Land lying on Swamp to be acknowledged to my son Joseph Var-
 nal then according to law: and as for all the rest of my Estate I give
 to my loving wife Elizabeth Varnal to my youngest son John Varnal &
 that he shall have during both to read & write to cast Accounts so far
 as the Rules of three kind if he dies without issue the Plantation to be
 to Thomas Varnal after the decease of his mother and Thomas Varnal
 where he now lives shall be to William Varnal to have and to hold for
 ever furthermore I have made and appointed my loving wife and
 loving son Thomas Varnal to be my Executors to see that my Will
 of fulfilled Witness our hand this tenth day of March in the year of
 our Lord seventeen hundred & thirty six

 Nathan Moor, W. Haper, Jacob Moor - Joseph Varnal

 November 28th 1737

The last Will and testament of Joseph Varnal deceased was presented
 in Court by Elizabeth Varnal & Thomas Varnal the Exors therein named
 who made oath thereto according to Law and being proved by the Oaths
 of Nathan Moor and Jacob Moor two of the Witnesses thereto is admitted
 to record.

In the name of God Amen I John Chapman of the County of Wight
 in Virginia being in perfect health and of a disposing
 mind and memory blessed be almighty God do make ordain constitute
 and appoint this my last Will and Testament in manner and form
 following -
 I first and principally above all things I commit my Soul to God the
 Father of Spirits trusting and assuredly believing thro the Death and
 Sacrifice of my Saviour and Redeemer Jesus Christ to receive full pardon
 for all my sins and my body to the earth from whence it came to be disem-
 -bed I leave at the discretion of my Exors hereafter named and for what
 worldly goods it hath pleased God to bestow upon me my Just debts be-
 -ing first paid I give and bequeath as follows
 I hereby give unto my Daughter Patience Wyles five Shillings
 then I give and bequeath unto my son John Chapman my Bath Seal &
 five Shillings then I give and bequeath unto my son Charles Chapman

my great Bible and my other books of History and Devotion
 them I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary Chapman her
 Mother's dressing box and Bell metal Skillet. My Will and desire
 is that my Son John Chapman take care of his Mother's health and
 bring him up to his trade which he now follows, and further my Will
 and desire is that my two Sons William and Thomas Chapman continue
 with their Mother if please God she live untill they come to the age
 fourteen have each of them two years schooling within the term and
 then be bound out Apprentices untill they attain to the age of twenty
 One years to such trades their Inclinations leads them to and my
 desire is that my Sons Charles and John Chapman's whom I have
 joined see that my two Sons William and Thomas Chapman be bound
 according to my Will and desire

Now I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Mary Chapman the man-
 ageable use of my Estate during her widowhood afterwards to be equally
 divided between her and my five children Mary Joseph William Thomas
 and Elizabeth Chapman or the Survivors of them and I do nominate and
 appoint my loving wife Mary and my Son Charles Chapman Executors of
 this my last Will & Testament making all other Wills by me heretofore
 made Null and Void and this only to be taken for my last Will In Witness
 Whereof I have hereunto set my hand and fixed my Seal this 10th day
 of Septemb: 1736
