My Item I do give and Bequeath all the Remaining part of my Estate both in Doards and out, be it of what Nature or Quality soever unto my wellbeloved Wife Ann Hampton whom I do appoint my whole & sole Executrix to fulfill this my last Will and Testament And I do Revok all other former Will whatsoever made by me Whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this Nineteenth Day of February One Thousand Seven Hundred & Thirty Five
