I John Stevenson of the Isle of Wight County in Virginia do make this my
 last Will & testament in manner and form as followeth First I recommend
 my Soul to Almighty God the maker and giver of it secondly my body to
 the Earth to be buried by my Executors hereafter named and all my worldly
 goods I give as followeth

- Item I give unto my Son John Stevenson five shillings Curr^t money & no more
- Item I give unto my Son Peter Stevenson five shillings ^{curr^t money} and no more
- Item I give unto my Son William Stevenson the parcel of Land that I bought
 of Edward Boykin being One hundred and four Acres to him & his heirs
 forever - Item I give to my Son Solomon the plantation and wood lots
 it being One hundred and sixty two acres to him and his heirs for ever
- Item I give to my son George fifty five hundred pounds of Tobacco out of my Estate
 to be paid to him at the age of eighteen Item I give to my son William all
 my Carpenters and Wheel wrights tools and his and his said my son
- Item I give to my son George One cow and calf and one horse and one sheep
- Item I give to my son George One cow and calf my horse and one sheep
- Item I give to my daughter Mary One cow and calf two pewter dishes two pewter
 plates One small Chest one Box of spoons - Item I give to my daughter Elizabeth
 One Cow calf two pewter dishes two pewter plates half a dozen of pewter spoons
 and one small Chest

3 I give all the rest of my Estate to my wife Katherine during her widowhood but if she marry then that part to be equally divided between my wife and three of my Children Mary, William, Elizabeth, George & Solomon I do make Homage and appoint my loving wife Katherine to be my Executor of this my last will and testament as Witness my hands this 24th day of February 1734 To have his heirs for ever Intertitulum
