 tament first I commit my Soul to God who gave it lawfully
 believing that I shall receive full pardon of all my sins and inherit
 Eternal Life through the Death and merits of my Redeem-
 er and Redeemer Jesus Christ and for all my worldly
 Estate as it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow upon I give
 and dispose as followeth. Viz.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto Robert Jones the plantation where
 on he now lives and eighty Acres of Land belonging to it to
 him and his Heirs & Assigns for ever.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto Mary Davis my Housekeeper, one
 good feather Bed & Furniture Three Virginia leather Chairs one
 frying Pan one Iron pot three she Cattell a few heifer and
 Yearling and Males to build a house Twenty foot long and
 Twelve foot wide to her and to her disposing.

Item I Give unto thes^e Mary Davis fifty Acres of Land on the south
 side of the Lyons Branch bounding on William Stokes Land
 During her Natural Life. My Will is that that thes^e Mary
 Davis have one lower Room of my house to her own disposing
 for twelve Months after my Decease, also I Will that the said
 Mary Davis have liberty to beat sixty Gallons of Liden in my
 Orchard of such fruit thes^e Orchard bring for two years &
 after my Decease.

Item I Give and Bequeath unto my son Jonas Williams all the Remain-
 der part of my Estate Real & Personal and I do Appoint my son
 Jonas to be my whole and sole Executor of this my last Will and
 Testament Whereunto I have set my hand and seal the 12th
 day of March 1740/1
