Memorandum of a Verbal Will made by Francis Williamson Jun^r dec^d in these words as followeth viz

I give unto my wife a Negro call'd Tom. I give unto my Son Francis a Negro call'd Jacob. I give unto my Son James a Negro call'd Patience. I give unto my Son Benjamin a Negro call'd Roger. I give unto my Son Joseph a Negro call'd Sampson. I give unto my Daughter Martha a Negro call'd Harry. I give unto my Daughter Sarah a Negro call'd Anne and if she brings two children one I give to my Daughter Mourning and the other to my son Standy. and all the rest of her increase I give to my Daughter Sarah and all the rest of my Estate to be divid^d among them
