And to have a joyfull Resurrection at the last Day I Give & Bequeath my soul to God who gave it to me and my Body to the Earth from whence it was taken to be Buried in a Decent manner at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named and as touching such worldly Estate as it hath pleased God in mercy to bestow upon me I Give Devise and Dispose thereof in manner and forme as followeth

Imp^{ort}. It is my Will and Desire that all my just Debts which I in Equity & Good Conscience owe to any pason or persons be truly and Honestly Satisfied and Paid within convenient Time after my Decease by my Executors hereafter Named &c.

Item I Give and Bequeath to my Loving Mother my Negro Girl Grace and my Best Bed and Covering, I Say she and her increase to my said Mother and heirs for Ever.

Item I Give my Plantation that I now live on and all the Land belonging to it to my Brother In. Daughtry son Rich. I say to him and his Heirs for Ever.

Item I Give unto my Brother John Daughtry all my Stock of Cattle and Hogs and Sheep.

Item I Give my Sword to my Cousen William Daughtry my Brother John Daughtry's son.

Item I Give my other Bed to my Brother John Daughtry.

Item I give my Horse to my Brother John Daughtry son John

Item I give unto my sister Mary Scotland a Dish one Bason and a plate

Item I give unto my sister Elizabeth Hoaglin one Dish one Bason and two plates

Item It is my will and Desire after my just Debts and funniall expences are fully satisfied That my Brother John Daughtry should have ^{all} the remainder part of my Estate to him and his Heirs for ever

Item I nominate and appoint my said Brother John Daughtry the Executor of this my Last Will and Testament In a Testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand and fixed my seal the Day and ^{first} year above Written
