of all my Sins and my body to the Earth from whence it came to be
decently buried at the discretion of the Exor: hereafter named and
as concerning all my worldly goods which it hath pleased God to
bless me with I give and bequeath as followeth Item I give and
bequeath unto my son John Sharrow fifteen pence Item I give
bequeath unto my daughter Elizth Thomas fifteen pence Item
I give and bequeath unto my daughter Eleanor Thomas fifteen
pence Item I give and bequeath unto my Grandson William Sharrow
all the remaining part of my Estate Witnef my hand this 5th day
of January 1736 I leave my friend Joseph Sharrow fully and wholy
my Exor: of this my last Will and testament
