decency buried at the discretion of the Exqr: hereafter named and
as concerning all my worldly goods which it hath pleased God to
endue me with I give and bequeath as followeth Item I give and
bequeath unto my son John Sharro fifteen pounds Item I give
and bequeath unto my daughter Eliz: Thomas fifteen pounds Item
I give and bequeath unto my daughter Eleonard Thomas fifteen
pounds Item I give and bequeath unto my Grandson William Stevens
all the remaining part of my Estate Dated by my hand this 23rd day
